

NOTICE OF TANF-STATE PROGRAM TIME LIMIT

TANF-SP IS INTENDED TO BE TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE. State law limits how long you can get TANF-SP benefits to a total of 60 months. This is a life-time limit.

The following guidelines are used to determine the number of state time limited months you have used:

- Any TANF benefit you receive that counts toward the Federal Time Limit.
- Any TANF-SP benefit you received.

After a caretaker/second parent reaches the end of the TANF-SP Time Limit, they and anyone in their household receiving benefits, are ineligible for TANF-SP for life. **EXCEPTION:** Benefits received as an eligible child do not count toward the time limit if the child is later certified as a caretaker or second parent.

You will be informed when you reach the end of the TANF-SP Time Limit.

NOTE: After receiving your 60 months of countable TANF-SP benefits, you and other members of your household may still be eligible for Medicaid and Food Stamps even if you are working.
