¹ Personal Care Services (PCS) are similar to PHC but PCS serves individuals 20 years of age and younger; PCS is operated under the auspices of the Texas Department of State Health Services.

² A related condition must occur before the age of 22 and the individual must have substantial functional limitations in at least three of the six major life skill areas assessed. DADS approved list of Diagnostic Codes for Persons with Related Conditions includes diagnoses such as autism, cerebral palsy, traumatic brain injury and rubella syndrome.
